



Ground-breaking for the new Evangelical United Church of Christ at the site on the Arkansas Road began April 25, 1962.






The actual ground-breaking ceremonies were held on a windy Sunday morning, April 29, 1962





Construction during the summer of 1962 was tremendously fast.





The highlight of construction was the raising of the sixty-foot arch on August 16, 1962.






Another interesting feat was the placing of the pre-cast concrete roof over the large social hall. Each section was lifted up by two cranes and put together atop the hall.





All of the construction was being hurried to meet the dedication deadline.




On September 30, 1962 construction was far enough along to permit cornerstone-laying ceremonies.

Besides the new cornerstone, there were three others set in the memorial chapel wall. These were the ones from 1878, 1921 and 1934.








At that time many members of the congregation were helping lay sod in preparation for the dedication.


Finally, the climax to all of the hustle and bustle came on July 28, 1963, with the dedication ceremonies. There were two services held in the morning for members of the congregation. That afternoon an open house was held. Then in the evening there was a service open to the public with tours of the new church following the service. In just a little more than a year, a beautiful sanctuary, parsonage, and bell tower were built and dedicated to the service of our Lord and Master.








Church Kitchen



# Dining Room: Seating Capacity 500; Dining Capacity 350










