
## *They're the Best Kind of Folks We Know*







Thanks to the combined efforts and hard work of the two classes and Director Mrs. Pamela Ott, the play proved to be a great success.






















# Administration Honors Scholars






## *New Planning and Programs Meet Needs of Growing HHS*

















Gaye Michael broke the only school record this year. Gaye ran the 440-yard dash in 52.3. Craig Manwaring held the old record with a 52.9.






# Art Club Tours, Travels, and Paints







Turning their attentions to the construction of the Homecoming float, the girls decided on a creative "Mug the Knights" for their theme.




