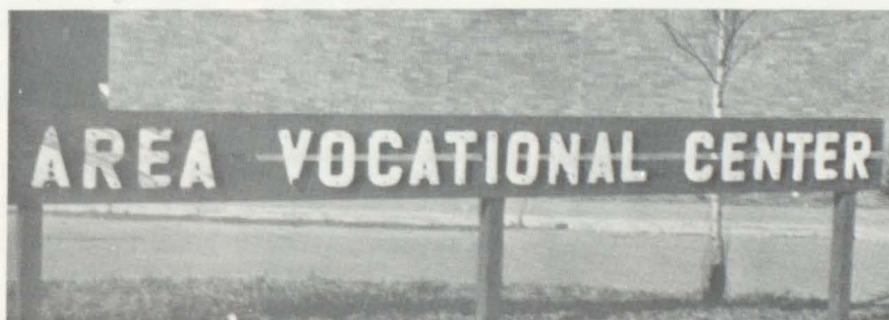


Concurrent Admissions

Co-Op



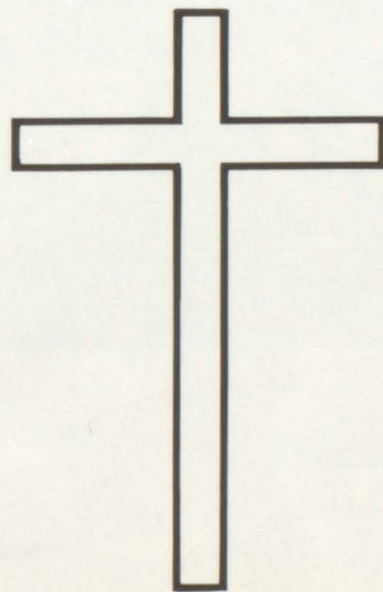

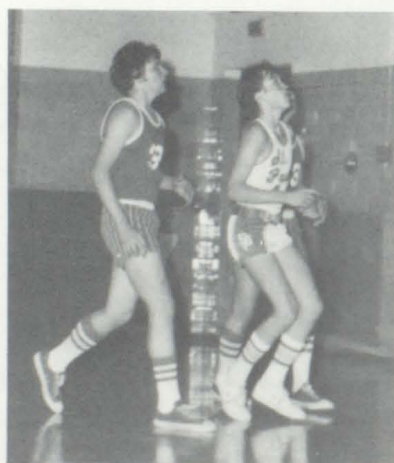


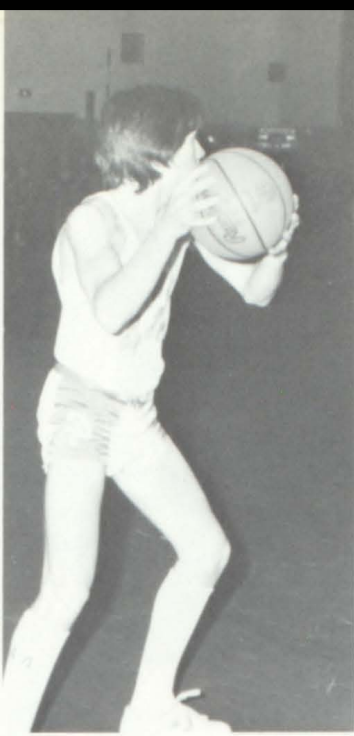
Freshmen Basketball
